THE PURIFICATION OF THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY AND THE PRESENTATION OF OUR LORD Thursday 2 February A+D 2023





This evening we will celebrate Holy Communion

Visitors who have not before received communion from Pastor McCall are kindly asked to speak with him before Divine Service begins and before approaching the altar for the first time. Because Holy Communion is a confession of the faith which is confessed at this altar and because those who eat and drink our Lord's Body and Blood unworthily do so to their great harm, it is very important to speak with pastor before service if you desire the Blessed Sacrament. Also, those who receive the Lord's Supper at Our Savior Evangelical Lutheran Church are baptized Christians who have been instructed in and publicly confess the Evangelical Lutheran faith. For these reasons, *only members of this congregation or sister congregations of the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod* receive Holy Communion at this altar. If you have any questions regarding the doctrine and practice of Closed Communion, please talk to the pastor before or after the Divine Service.

THE PRELUDE

The bell tolls three times to signify the beginning of service in reverence of the Holy Trinity. Please STAND at the sound of the tolls and face the Processional Crucifix.

THE BLESSING OF THE CANDLES

The Lord be with you.



Let us pray. O Lord Jesus Christ, the true Light who illumines everyone who comes into the world: we beseech You to pour out Your + blessing on these and all the church's candles, and +sanctify them with the light of Your grace; and mercifully grant that even as their flame scatters the darkness of night; so our hearts, being inflamed with the inward brightness of Your Holy Spirit, may be delivered from all blindness of iniquity; and that the eyes of our souls may clearly perceive that which is wellpleasing in Your sight and profitable for our salvation; and that finally after the darkness and dangers of this world are passed, we may come to the never-failing Light, through You, O blessed Jesus, Redeemer of the world, for You live and reign with the Father and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever.



O Lord Jesus Christ, who appeared among men in the substance of our flesh, and on this day was presented by Mary and Joseph in the temple, and whom the venerable Simeon, being enlightened by the light of Your Spirit, knew and blessed by taking You in his arms: mercifully grant that the grace of the same Holy Spirit may also enlighten and instruct us; so that we may confess You truly and love You faithfully, Who lives and reigns with the Father and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever.



The candles are lit, from hand to hand, beginning with the pastor, who lights his from a candle on Christ's holy altar. Tilt your unlit candle toward the flame to light it and hold it upright thenceforth. Once all candles are lit, the pastor will return from the rear of the nave to the chancel via the middle aisle. He will stop at the baptismal font to reverence the fully lit altar of Christ, thus giving praise to God for the Eternal Light that shines upon each of us in the darkness in which we dwell. The congregation is invited to follow the pastor, reverence (bow) toward Christ's altar while at the font, and turn to the right or left to return to the pews via the outside aisles. During this procession, the pastor will chant the antiphonal Nunc Dimittis on the next page. He will repeat the canticle as many times as needed to allow as many as wish to reverence the altar to do so.







The Lord be with you.




The Holy Gospel according to St. Luke, the second chapter.



+ When the days of Mary's purification according to the law of Moses were completed, they brought Jesus to Jerusalem to present Him to the Lord (as it is written in the law of the Lord, "Every male who opens the womb shall be called holy to the LORD"), and to offer a sacrifice according to what is said in the law of the Lord, "A pair of turtledoves or two young pigeons." And behold, there was a man in Jerusalem whose name was Simeon, and this man was just and devout, waiting for the Consolation of Israel, and the Holy Spirit was upon him. And it had been revealed to him by the Holy Spirit that he would not see death before he had seen the Lord's Christ. So he came by the Spirit into the temple. And when the parents brought in the Child Jesus, to do for Him according to the custom of the law, he took Him up in his arms and blessed God and said: "Lord, now You are letting Your servant depart in peace, according to Your word; for my eyes have seen Your salvation which You have prepared before the face of all peoples, a light to bring revelation to the Gentiles, and the glory of Your people Israel."

This is the Gospel of the Lord.



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
ST. LUKE 2:22-32






