Once the Retiring Procession reaches the narthex, depart in # peace.

What you may notice to be different today: Acolyte - Since the infant days of the Church, pastors have raised up assistants so that their focus could be more dedicated to the duties of the Ministry of Word and Sacrament (see Acts 6/ Apostelgeschichte 6). As the Church grew in its early years and the Divine Service became more intricate and involved, assistants became valuable all the more. So, the men installed into the Office of Pastor trained up other young men from within the Church to serve under their authority (as the ordained and called servants of Christ) within the Divine Service. These young men were deemed "Acolytes", a term derived from the Greek word ἀκόλουθος (akolouthos), which literally means "follower". The position of acolyte in the service of the Church has for many, many centuries given these young men the opportunity to follow in the footsteps of the pastor in the Divine Service, to aid Christ's servant in his duties, and to also give these followers the opportunity to get close to the focal events of the Divine Service in the chancel, thus aiding them as a possible first step toward becoming pastors eventually themselves. This pattern is also seen in the Old Testament prophet Samuel's young days as he followed Eli the priest in the service of the temple of the LORD (see 1 Samuel 3/1. Buch Samuel 3).

The use of acolytes in the Divine Service is a practice dating back over 1,700 years, with first mentions of them coming in the third century AD. And it was a welcomed continuance in the Lutheran churches during the time of the Reformation.

Most acolyte responsibilities are limited to the lighting and extinguishing of candles before and after Divine Service, respectively, but in our combined service, our *acolyte* will also serve as *crucifer*.

A **crucifer** is the (often young, but not always) man who carries the **processional crucifix**. Christ and Him Crucified, as portrayed boldly and artistically in the carved wooden crucifix that we use, leads the way into and out of Divine Service as the man ordained and installed into the Office of Christ, in our case Pastor McCall, enters the holy place of God to bring Christ's Word and Sacrament to the people of the Lord. The Gospel Procession, the reading of the Holy Gospel, is another place in Divine Service in which the crucifer leads the way with the processional crucifix as the Holy Gospel, the very words of Jesus Christ Himself, makes its way out to be proclaimed in the midst of those who dwell on earth. This is a magnificent physical reminder that the Son of God came down from heaven, was incarnate by the Holy Spirit of the Virgin Mary, and was made Man. This God-Man dwelt among us and we behold His glory as His precious Gospel is proclaimed into our ears! (see John 1/*Johannes 1*).
