



¹¹Truly, I say to you, among those born of women there has arisen no one greater than John the Baptist. Yet the one who is least in the kingdom of heaven is greater than he."






NICENE CREED







What you may notice to be different today:

Baptismal Font - though not previously lacking a font, Abiding Savior's holy space now has Mount Olive's solid marble baptismal font sitting in a new location. This is not an unusual place for it because church architecture, and even furnishings' placement, often carry great meaning. Through the waters of Holy Baptism, God Almighty works salvation and delivers the baptized out of death into life everlasting. Baptism is the sinner's entrance into the Kingdom of God, so as we His children come to feast at His Table in the Divine Service, making our way up to receive Holy Communion, we walk by the blessed font where God put His sacred Triune name of the Father, and of the \bigstar Son, and of the Holy Spirit upon us, making us His very own. Keeping the font in this central position reminds us always, especially during the Divine Service, that now as His baptized children we may approach the Holy One of Heaven with boldness and no fear as we receive what He desires to give to us in the Lord's Supper.

Torches - *tall candle holders located to either side of the lectern where the Scriptures are read;* as we learned last week of the importance in olden days to have acolytes, *followers*, to aid in the Divine Service, one of the items they have helped with over the centuries is the lighting. Candles being held near the sacred texts while the pastor read them were necessary in the very long preelectricity era. The candles also serve another purpose in signifying the light of Christ coming to His people in His Holy Word in the Divine Service. **Altar Crucifix** - *brass; sitting upon the glass gradine above the altar;* this is part of the three-piece brass set (crucifix + two candleholders) used for many, many decades on the altar of Mount Olive. It is a beautiful, physical confession that He Who died for the sins of the world on the tree of the cross comes to us at this, His altar, to deliver upon our tongues heavenly food, His Own Body and Blood, for the forgiveness of our sins.
