This morning/evening we will celebrate Holy Communion. Because those who eat and drink our Lord's body and blood unworthily do so to their great harm and because Holy Communion is a confession of the faith which is confessed at this altar, we ask that any who have not received Holy Communion from Pastor McCall and desire to receive the Sacrament to first speak with the pastor.

The Season of Lent and Ceremonies at Abiding Savior/ Mount Olive

Our liturgical preparation for Easter takes place through three distinct periods or steps. The first was Pre-Lent. The second is Lent, the time between Ash Wednesday and Judica. The final step is Passion.

We continue, during Lent, to abstain from the Alleluias and Gloria in Excelsis. The color is violet to signify the mourning of a monarch.

We now use give up most chanting, singing only the ordinaries and hymns. The Gospel is now read from the horn of the altar, and there is no Gospel procession. The crucifixes, however, remain unveiled and we retain the Gloria Patri.

As is the case with all fasting in Christendom, we give things up in order to subdue our flesh and to enhance our joy in these things when they return. For the time comes, indeed, when we shall fast no more.

The season is meant to order our hearts and minds not only by consideration of the terrible cost of Our Lord's gracious sacrifice on our behalf, but also upon His willingness to be our Savior and to reconcile us to His Father. It is a catechetical season. So also, the entire season, as even our entire faith and hope, is observed in the sure and certain knowledge of the Resurrection.





THE IMPOSITION OF ASHES

The Faithful approach the Altar, as at Holy Communion, to be marked with ashes in the sign of the cross in remembrance of Holy Baptism. As directed by the usher, proceed to the rail, kneel (if able), and receive the ashes on your forehead hearing the words: "Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return."

There is no dismissal from the rail. After you receive the ashes, simply get up and return to your pew to SIT for the hymn. Before or after you have received the ashes, you may wish to meditate on one or more of the following Psalms, located near the front of LSB: Psalms 6, 32, 38, 51, 102, 130, or 143.

Once all have returned to their seats, the hymn is sung.



THE NICENE CREED
